- 40 CFR 435, Subpart C wastewater discharges from unconventional (shale or oil and gas facilities
- Effective August 29, 2016, extended to November 28, 2016 in a 09/30/16 FR
- No discharge from production, field exploration, drilling, well completion, or well treatment (drilling muds, drill cuttings, produced sand, or produced water)

Conventional Oil and Gas Extraction

- Data Needed from Local Programs
 - Discharges to POTWs
 - Impacts from wastewater management
 - Requests to discharge at POTW
 - Loadings of discharges

Produced Water Discharges Oil and Gas

40 CFR Part 435, Subpart E

- Good enough quality for wildlife/livestock watering or agricultural
- Quantity, composition, and purpose of well treatment and workover fluids

Centralized Waste Treatment

- Study of CWTs that accept Oil and Gas wastewater
 - which CWT facilities accept such wastewater,
 - available treatment technologies (and their associated costs),
 - discharge characteristics,
 - financial characteristics of CWT facilities, and
 - environmental impacts of discharges from CWT facilities.

Dental Amalgam

- Signed by the EPA administrator on September 23, 2014
- 40 CFR Part 441
- January 23, 2017
- Regulatory Freeze

NPDES Update Rule

- Signed on May 5, 2016, The proposed rule:
 - Eliminates inconsistences between regulations and application forms;
 - Improves permit documentation, transparency, and oversight;
 - Clarifies existing regulations; and
 - Deletes outdated provisions.

NPDES Update Rule

The proposed rule covers:

- permit applications;
- permit objection,
- Permit documentation,
- Public Notice and other process efficiencies; vessels exemptions;
- CWA section 401 certification process.

NPDES Update Rule

- Revising the NPDES permit application forms,
- Improving the consistency and updating the applications,
- Address permit documentation, EPA State permit objection, and public participation procedures
- For example, post notices of draft NPDES permits and other permit actions on State agency Web sites.
- Still in proposal ...(?)

Method Update Rule (MUR)

- provide increased flexibility to the regulated community
- improve data quality
- update the methods, to keep current with technology advances
- address laboratory contamination issues related to the MDL and better account for intra-laboratory variability.

Method Update Rule (MUR)

- MUR include revised methods published by EPA
- Adding certain methods reviewed under the alternate test procedures (ATP) program to 40 CFR Part 136,
- Clarifying the procedures for EPA approval of nationwide and limited use ATPs.
- Revising the procedure for determination of the method detection limit (MDL).

Method Update Rule (MUR)

- Proposed Rule February 19, 2015
- Extension of Comment period March 20, 2015

• Signed on December 15, 2016



Electronic Reporting Rule

- Federal Register October 22, 2015
- Final Rule-NPDES E-Reporting Rule-FR Vol 80, No 204-pp 64064-64158
- Effective Date December 21, 2015
- Reduces burden of existing paper-based reporting from regulated facilities and reduces third-party data entry errors by instead requiring electronic data submissions;

Electronic Reporting Rule

- Phase 1 DMR Submissions & Biosolids Reports (21 Dec 2016)
- Phase 2 General Permit and Program
 Reports (21 Dec 2020)

Key Concepts

- Proposed regulation will require that NPDES permittees electronically submit most of the required NPDES data (e.g., DMRs, NOIs, program reports) directly to states or EPA.
 - Data submissions would meet EPA's current signatory and chain of custody requirements in Parts 3 (CROMERR) and 122 (NPDES Regs)
- Permittee electronic submissions will be supplemented by authorized state electronic submission:
 - Basic facility and permit data; and
 - Data originating from the states (e.g., inspections, violation determinations, enforcement actions).

Pretreatment Annual Reports

- EPA requires all Pretreatment annual program reports to be electronically submitted to states or EPA in 2020 (Phase 2).
- Technical Workgroup Every 2 weeks
- Section F of NPDES Permit Application 2A
- Pretreatment Annual Report



Improved Public Access to Data

- ECHO is EPA's public access tool for NPDES program information.
- ECHO is updated on a weekly basis with ICIS-NPDES data.
- ECHO provides data with a dashboard view.



Improved Public Access to Data

- Number and names of POTWs with approved programs;
- Number and names of industrial users (IUs) in cities without pretreatment programs inspected or sampled;
- Number of significant industrial users (SIUs) and categorical industrial users (CIUs) in approved pretreatment programs and number without control mechanisms
- Number and name of IUs in cities without pretreatment programs that are in compliance/not in compliance with their monitoring/reporting requirements;
- Number and names of IUs that have been issued enforcement actions including the type of enforcement (SNC publication, AO, APO), who issued it (EPA, state, POTW), and any dollar amounts;



- 13th National Take Back Saturday, April 29, 2017


11th National Take Back Day: April 30, 2016

Total Law Enforcement Participation: 4,264




11th National Take Back Day: April 30, 2016
